Embrace the Mission

DISCUSSION:

1. At Crosslink, our mission is to "Impact the Valley and Bless the Nations with the Gospel of Jesus Christ." What are some ways that you see us accomplishing this? What part should each member play in accomplishing this?
2. According to Matthew 28:19-20, what did Jesus command His disciples to do? According to Acts 1:8, when should they do this? In thinking about Acts 10, why do you think the disciples hadn't yet accomplished this?
3. What are some things that God did or allowed in Acts 8-10 to ensure that the early church fulfilled His plan? What does this teach us today?
4. We saw in Acts 10, how God used Peter's sight and his hearing to discover what He was calling him to do. How does God use the same in our lives today? Why do we often miss what He is wanting us to do? What is the solution?
5. As a group, list some of the respectable characteristics of Cornelius. Now describe his spiritual condition. How is he similar to many "religious" people today? What was his greatest need?
6. Read Romans 10:14-15 and answer the following questions:
 - How do people learn about Jesus?
 - What must people do to be saved? (See also John 3:16)
 - What part do we play in this as Christians?
7. How did God's call on Peter, in Acts 10 make him uncomfortable? Describe the progress of how God led him one step at a time. What did this require of him? How have you experienced the same in your life?
8. What did Peter discover through his faith and obedience? What does this teach us about God and His purpose in our lives?
9. When Peter shared the Good News, what proofs did he offer to explain that Jesus is Lord? How do these three truths still stand true today? How can we share them personally with others?
10. What was the result of Peter embracing the mission that God called him to? How do we still see the same result today?
